

This question from the Order of Malta is posed to every candidate seeking to advance in the Christian Degrees of Templary. But who of us can comprehend death on a cross? Who of us can reconcile the enigma that God showed his love for us through the agonizing death of His Son?

Our various faiths and our professions as Christian Masons give us the strength to blindly accept God's love for each of us. Although we do not always understand fully where or by what means God is leading us, it is not ours to question His plan, but to follow Him to the best of our ability, knowing that He is ever in charge. As Christ knew that this cup could not pass from him, he teaches us to be ever mindful of our duty in accepting the will of God.

Masonry does not seek to interpret the word of God in so far as to endorse any particular religion or creed. But our professed belief in a Supreme Being, under whom we are brothers, gives us the commonality to aid and assist one another along the path of life.

Although I did not fully understand it at the time, I remember my grade school music teacher telling our class to "Remember, Easter is about more than just chocolate bunnies." That statement must have touched me, as I still recall it some 50 years later. What are we passing along to our friends and brothers, to our children and grandchildren that will be remembered? I pray that it is the understanding of God's infinite love for us, shown through the birth, life, death, resurrection and ascension of his Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

In closing I refer again to the Order of Malta. Sometimes we all need a little slap in the face to "Awake! Be not asleep to your duty, but watchful in the faith of Jesus Christ..."

At this blessed Easter season, may each of us take to heart the lessons of discipleship and follow wherever God may lead us.

There is one piece of Legislation presented this year.

“Be it now resolved that Section 306 paragraphs B and C be deleted and the following paragraphs be enacted:

“B. Nominations for the elected offices of Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Iowa shall be made in the following manner: The nominator will state only his name, Commandery Name and Number and the nominee’s name, Commandery Name and Number and the office to which he has been nominated without further comment. Seconds to the nomination shall be made in the same manner as the nomination.

“C. Nominations for the office of Grand Captain General shall be made in the following manner: The nominator will state his name, Commandery Name and Number and the nominee’s name, Commandery Name and Number and the office for which he is being nominated. The Grand Commander MAY allow up to two minutes for presentation of information about the nominee by the nominator. The second to the nomination shall be made in the same manner as in paragraph B with no time allowed for additional information. When more than one name is in nomination, the election shall be by secret ballot. If only one name is in nomination election may be done by acclamation.”

Grand Recorder Willard M. Loper, PGC, moved for approval of all reports as printed in the Book of Preliminary Reports which includes the budget. The motion was properly seconded and approved.

I wish I could report an improvement this Templar year in membership in our Commanderies of Iowa, but I can't. This will be my last year as Membership Chairman; this duty will go to who ever the Grand Commander appoints this coming Grand Conclave.

I have served as membership chairman since 2005, and I have run out of ideas as to how to get new members; it is time for new blood.

I will still preach that we need to have our priorities in correct order. Only a suggestion on my part, but maybe the Executives should focus on Membership and have District Commander's visit Blue Lodges, as well as all Commanderies in their District, to show the DVD on York Rite.

Membership should be our number one priority and we, as Sir Knights of Iowa, need to address that number one concern, not just talk about it. Ritual and Tactics should be second priority, where we will hopefully impress and energize new members to get active in their local Commandery.

The following are the Knighting for the past 3 years.

2008—6/1/2008 to 5/31/2009-----63 Knighting.

Once again I will repeat what I wrote last year. Death is our biggest cause of membership losses, which we cannot control, followed with suspension for non-payment of dues. In Jan 1, 1986 the Sir Knights of Iowa totaled 7,424 by Jan 1, 2004 the membership of Iowa was 3,283. Sir Knights of Iowa, this averages out to losses of 243 members per year for the last 17 years. By Jan 1, 1986 there was a total of 158 Knighting in the State of Iowa, and there was a total of 50 Commanderies in the State of Iowa. By Jan 1, 2004, there were a grand total of 39 Knighting in the State of Iowa, and there was a total of 44 Commanderies. We now have 38 Commanderies in Iowa, how many will we lose next year?

Sir Knights, do you see what I mean about membership crisis? Where will we be in ten more years?

I did not send out a letter of invite to each and every new Master Mason raised in Iowa this year. I did however send out the DVD upon request, which is a 10-minute clip that covers Blue Lodge, Chapter, Council, and Commandery to join in the fellowship of York Rite Masonry. The DVD is well put together, in that it explains in great detail about how Blue Lodge and York Rite Masonry are closely related. As a suggestion, the DVD could be used as an educational tool in Blue Lodge or at a friendship night, with a speaker to answer questions.

Membership is the responsibility of every Sir Knight in Iowa. We all must know a non-York Rite Mason, which you can personally invite to join York Rite, and learn the rest of the story. Remember MEMBERSHIP IS THE LIFE BLOOD OF OUR BELOVED COMMANDERIES; IF WE LOSE THAT LIFE BLOOD WE DIE. Please Sir Knights of Iowa take a positive attitude and initiative to speak to a Master Mason about joining York Rite, do your part and be part of the York Rite Team. Remember there is no I in Team, and I as one person can only do so much; we need to work together as a team, Sir Knights.

### **Final Report of the Jurisprudence Committee**

“Be it now resolved that Section 306 paragraphs B and C be deleted and the following paragraphs be enacted:

“B. Nominations for the elected offices of Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Iowa shall be made in the following manner: The nominator will state only his name, Commandery name and number and the nominee’s name, Commandery name and number and the office to which he has been nominated without further comment. Seconds to the nomination shall be made in the same manner as the nomination.

“C. Nominations for the office of Grand Captain General shall be made in the following manner: The nominator will state his name, Commandery name and number and the nominee’s name, Commandery name and number and the office for which he is being nominated. The Grand Commander MAY allow up to two minutes for presentation of information about the nominee by the nominator. The second to the nomination shall be made in the same manner as in paragraph B with no time allowed for additional information. When more than one name is in nomination, the election shall be by secret ballot. If only one name is in nomination election may be done by acclamation.”

### **Address of David M. Dryer Department Commander North Central Department Grand Encampment**

### **Knights Templar of the United States of America**

“Thank You Sir Knights.

“Right Eminent Grand Commander, Right Eminent Grand Captain General, Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander:

“I wish to begin by saying how pleased I am to be here again. Thank you for your hospitality extended to me and to my family. You have always treated us so graciously, and we all look forward to attending the Iowa Grand Commandery Session in Ames next year.

“At this, my second appearance at the Iowa Grand Conclave Session as North Central Department Commander, I want to again pay special tribute to two individuals Sir Knight James N. Karnegis – Sir Knight Doc and Sir Knight Jeffrey N. Nelson – Sir Knight Admiral Lord Nelson as I affectionately refer to him - for all they have done for Templary. I admire and respect them. I am honored to have the opportunity to continue to serve with him.

“I want you to be aware of the Grand Encampment Officer’s New Year’s Resolutions for 2011, reported by the Grand Master in the January issue of the KT magazine earlier this year.

1. Make Templary the most prestigious order one may petition.
2. Expand this order throughout the world.
3. Stabilize membership during the 65th Triennium.
4. Increase the visibility of the order
5. Grow our permanent fund to a level where the order will be self-sustaining.
6. Establish closer associations between Grand Commanderies, Department Commanders and Grand Commandery Coordinators.
7. Improve the quality of the ritualistic work being done.

“Following up on the New Year’s resolutions I have just read, I wish to invite each of you and ALL Iowa Sir Knights to attend the North Central Department meeting scheduled for 22 October 2011, in Des Moines, Iowa. All Sir Knights are welcome to attend, and the Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, Grand Captain-General and Grand Recorder of each jurisdiction is each EXPECTED to attend. It is your responsibility. It is part of your job that you have most solemnly and sincerely promised to perform to the best of your ability. This meeting will be conducted by the Grand Master and his staff. It will be your opportunity to learn about the future direction of the York Rite of Freemasonry and to meet and get to know the leaders from other states. Registration will begin Friday the 21st of October and Grand Encampment will be sending out registration forms later this year.

“The next matter I would like to address is TRAVEL close to home. I commend at this time Right Eminent Grand Commander Boehmer for appreciating the importance of traveling and being seen during his year as Grand Commander both within the North Central Department and within the State of Iowa. Right Eminent Grand Commander Dennis N. Boehmer, you took your job seriously. I thank you Sir Knight!

“Iowa Sir Knights have traveled well through the years. You have attended Grand Sessions in other States and you responded well when local Lodges, Chapters, Councils and Commanderies have asked for help and assistance. I challenge the Sir Knights in this room to continue this fine strong tradition.

“The Grand Commanders of Minnesota and South Dakota have advised you of when and where they will meet. Iowa Grand Chapter Grand Council will meet in Ames, August 11-13, this year. Iowa Grand Lodge will meet in Davenport, September 15-17, this year. Nebraska York Rite will meet in Columbus, April 12-14, 2012, and North Dakota will meet in Mandan, April 20-1, 2012.

“Go there. Meet their leaders. See how they operate. Steal their great ideas and avoid their misguided and less than stellar initiatives! I also urge you to attend the 65th Triennial Session in Alexandria, Virginia, in August of 2012.

“Next I am going to speak about MEMBERSHIP. I have read this year’s Preprinted Reports. The numbers for this past year are better than they appear in the Membership Report submitted by Chairman Zummak. Those figures are correct through April 20th. There have been at least 16 more Knightings since then. That is good but not good enough. Sir Knight Zummak’s wise council about membership being our life’s blood is something that we cannot ignore.

“Unfortunately, the America we live in today has become to a large extent, ‘not a nation of joiners.’ In other words, if you ask someone to consider joining a club or a group of people, he will frequently reply, ‘I am not a joiner!’ If we are going to convince men to join OUR Order, we have to demonstrate to them that this is an Order with which they should want to be a part. We are good! We are worthwhile!

“I have been saying repeatedly for years that you will get new members if you talk to people ‘One on One’, look him in the eye and shake his hand. I have decided to change that suggestion right here today for the first time. I have concluded that some people either will not or cannot do that. I suspect that there are people in this room right now who will not or cannot do that. NOT because you do not want to get more members. Rather, it is because some people do not have the self assurance or self confidence to do it. If that describes you, I want you to know that I understand your situation. However, I will not absolve anyone in this room from the responsibility to try to grow this Order. I want you to get a teammate. I want you to get with one or two other members that you can be comfortable with when you attend a ‘Friendship Night’. The two or three of you can walk up to a prospect and pass the ball around so to speak. The two or three of you ask about his family and background – Tell him about the principals and tenants of the Masonic Bodies – Tell him we want you, and we invite you to become a part of this great organization. There is strength in numbers. It won’t hurt as much if someone refuses to be a ‘joiner.’ It will be a team victory when someone does join with us because you guys really believe in the Cause in which you are engaged and you guys convinced him that you believe in it. You must be persistent, be patient, be relentless and be committed.



“I now wish to address a subject that I have been ordered to address by Grand Master Koon – LEADERSHIP! That is the precious commodity for which there is no substitute. That is the fundamental quality that the LEADERS of Grand Encampment are obsessed with grooming and developing.

“Those who know me well, are aware that I often use military analogies as I deal with and address the trials and vicissitudes incident to human life.

“Today is June 4th. Can anyone in this room tell me what watershed event took place on this day in the history of the United States of America? Start of the Battle of Midway 6-4-42 WW II. How about two days from now June 6th? D-Day Invasion of Normandy 6-6-44 WW II

“In prior speeches I have spoken of Generals – Washington, Lee, Grant and MacArthur and the ‘Peasant General’ Peng (from the Red Chinese Army – or CCF as it was called). I have talked about Presidents – Lincoln, Truman, Nixon. Last September, in South Dakota, in one of my darkest speeches ever, I even spoke about General Secretaries of the Soviet Union – Krushchev and Marshal Stalin. This time I would prefer to talk about lower ranking military personnel. At the Battle of Midway and on the beaches of Normandy, Admiral Nimitz and General Eisenhower did not do anything! The big, high ranking hot shots did not do what had to be done to win! Lt. Commander Clarence Wade McClusky, Jr. did more than Nimitz or Spruance or Fletcher. At one point McClusky saw the Japanese Destroyer Arashi moving very rapidly in a direction away from where his planes had been ordered to go. McClusky deduced that that ship must be trying to catch up with the rest of the Japanese fleet. He ordered a change of course and followed that destroyer. He did not have enough fuel to mess around with a maybe/ perhaps/ hopefully successful search and destroy mission and still get back to their aircraft carrier. The pilots and crews of the other planes knew that, but they followed his orders.

“At the Normandy landings Eisenhower, Bradley and Patton were not there. If ever in the history of the United States Army there was a 1st Class, Top Notch, A # 1 Cluster Formation, it was on the beaches of Normandy. In an interview with Walter Cronkite 20 years later, General Eisenhower gave full credit for the success of the Allied Forces on 6 June 1944 to the fire team leaders, squad leaders, platoon sergeants and platoon leaders – the corporals and the sergeants and the lieutenants – NOT the Generals!

“My point here is to stress the importance of grooming and developing leadership at the local level. Sir Knights who have a commitment to, veneration for and fidelity to the local commandery. These are the people you will draw on to serve in the Grand Line. If you groom that first level of leadership, the higher level leadership will follow as a matter of course.

“Develop your own leadership style and let others do the same. Those of you who have dealt with me when I am in charge know what I am like. My name is David and my namesake was a man of blood who was forbidden by the Prophet Nathan, ‘...to build the House wherein the Lord God of Israel might be worshipped.’ Many of you have heard me say in a voice that can be heard in the next county, ‘I hope you enjoyed the meal. The Degree or Ceremony is scheduled to start at blank o’clock. I need the cast to move to the auditorium right now. I need the rest of you in your seats in 15 minutes!’ Sir Knights, I have read the body language. I am well aware that there are Brethren who obviously harbor resentment and hold me in contempt for big- fat-abrasive-bossy mouthism. However, if we make it through the day, I don’t care about resentment and contempt.

“General Bradley apparently always said please when he gave a command and said it in a pleasant manner. I admire that but have never been able to subdue my sense of urgency. General Patton apparently was virtually incapable of issuing orders that were not laced with profanity. I disapprove of profanity, regard it as irregular and un-Masonic and I try not to use it. I submit to you that each of these styles has been successful in its place with its appropriate sponsor. Go with the style that is effective for you and for others. People need and want guidance. They do not want meandering. Leaders demonstrate a firm hand. They lead.

“I submit to you that leadership and success are intimately intertwined. If you groom your own leadership skills and develop the same skills in others, most of your problems – including membership – will be taken care of over the long run.

“Sir Knights of Iowa and guests, I thank you again for your gracious hospitality and your attentiveness this afternoon. I like it here. I like being with you. I look forward to coming back.

“Thank you and good morning.”

“Most Worshipful Grand Master, Right Eminent Department Commander, Right Eminent Grand Commander, Sir Knights All:

“It is my privilege to bring you the greetings and best wishes of our Most Eminent Grand Master, William Howard Koon II. Also I would like to thank the Sir Knights of Iowa for the courtesy and the hospitality extended to me and my lady Lisa. I tell you that in my travels the hospitality of Iowa is second to none and I’m always pleased when we have the opportunity to visit this fine state.

“I wanted to note that Sir Knight Jim Karnegis was my immediate predecessor as Department Commander. When Jim completed his term, he wasn’t done serving Templary. He is serving a term as a Trustee on your Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

“Sir Knights, when you elected our Most Eminent Grand Master William Howard Koon II in Roanoke, Virginia, you heard the Grand Master say that if you were looking for the same-old, same-old, if you were looking for things to be done as they have always been done, if just drifting along was good enough, then Bill Koon wasn’t your man. However, if you were looking to move Templary forward, if you were looking for change, yes I’ll even use that dreaded word, if you were looking for innovation, then Bill Koon was your man. Sir Knights, you had the foresight of electing Bill Koon as Grand Master of this Grand Encampment. I don’t think you disappointed us because his watchword is Change. The Department Commander talked about some of the programs our Grand Master instituted. In my memory, he is the first Grand Master to publicly announce his goals for not only the triennium but each year of the triennium. As our Department Commander said, he publishes those goals in the magazine. He doesn’t stop there. At the end of the year, he publishes a report on the results; how did he do in trying to attain or meet those goals. I believe that is courageous. But he puts himself out there. He is trying to move Templary forward.

“One of the significant changes the Grand Master has secured has been the changes in the Knight Templar Magazine. How do you guys feel about that? Are you pleased with the changes the Grand Master has made? I can tell you that many of those changes were instituted by Sid Dorris. It was Sid’s vision, Sid’s talent that brought those changes to the magazine. We miss Sid every day. We miss his counsel. We miss his guidance. I know many of you have met John at Department Conferences and in addition to the work he is doing with the magazine, he is instrumental in the leadership program being developed by the Grand Encampment.

“I’d also like to recognize your own Sir Knight Bryce Hildreth. I don’t know how many of you know but Bryce served on the Editorial Review Board for the Knight Templar Magazine. So he is helping John to get articles for the magazine and really helping to improve that. So if you like the articles you are seeing, thank Bryce because he is one of the individuals that in working to recruit the type of talent to produce articles for the magazine.

“Other programs I won’t go into deeply, the York Rite Information System. Grand Master Koon inherited a computer system or information technology program system that was state of the art in 1985, but it wasn’t good enough for where we are going in the 21st century. So, again, Grand Master Koon led the charge to develop the York Rite Information System. We think that this system is going to be a much better system in tracking everything from membership to reporting membership information, recording contributions to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation and is really going to make vast improvements in how the Grand Encampment runs on a day-to-day basis.

“Another significant change is the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. We reviewed those changes in the magazine and you know that on December 31, direct patient care ceased. This is a very difficult decision for the Trustees of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. The Foundation was created in 1955. Of course, one of its missions was to cure and treat blindness. For example, at that time strabismus or crossed-eyes in children was a significant occurrence in the United States. But thanks to the research, sponsored by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, surgery for strabismus is almost a thing of the past and been replaced by treatment of exercise procedure developed by research that we sponsored through the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. As one researcher told us, he said “Sir Knights, you’ve essentially put yourselves out of business treating pediatric ophthalmology cases.” Trustees reviewed the records of the last year and discovered that we only treated again, surgery for individuals under 18 years of age, less than five individuals. The Board of Trustees took a close look at the statistics. A majority of the surgeries and direct care patients were cataract surgeries and individuals

over the age of 55. Now that is all fine and good but is that our mission. An individual who is 55 years of age, nearing the end of their working career, and if not treated in 10 years will be covered by Medicare. Whereas an individual under the age of 18 has their whole life ahead of them. If we can do something to help them, to enhance their life, they have their entire productive career ahead of them. So the Trustees took a significant step on moving from direct care into research and education. The Trustees feel that we receive a bigger bang for our buck by sponsoring pediatric ophthalmological research rather than cataract surgeries for 50 and 60 year old men.

"I know many of you were in Des Moines last fall when we presented a grant to a researcher at the University of Iowa and that is the type of research that you, Sir Knights, are funding. We intend to report fully on what the Knight Templar Eye Foundation means. To me, these are really exciting programs that we are funding.

"The Department Commander talked about the importance of the Department Conference and our leadership programs, so I really won't talk any more about that. I talked about the West Coast Easter observation last night. Again, I would encourage the Sir Knights of Iowa to give that consideration. The Grand Master doesn't care if you go East or West. He would like you to, at least, consider coming out to Southern California.

"In my travels I have a chance to see how other Commanderies operate, how other Conclaves are conducted and here in Iowa, Sir Knights, you have so much to be proud of. The Revile and Retreat ceremony, I haven't found another state that does that. It builds comradery among the participants.

"The ritual competition, I think it is also a tremendous gift. It encourages Sir Knights to attend the annual Conclave. For every hour on the floor, I don't know how many hours is spent practicing, working on the rituals. I also like the way the Board of Instruction handles the ritual competition. I think the key word is instruction. They instruct; they teach. They are really positive about it. I've been to inspections where they are critical. They turn people off with their negativity and their criticisms. I think it's human nature that when we are criticized like that some people have a tendency to say 'Well, I'll find something else to do with my time.'

"In conclusion, Sir Knight Dennis, I'd like to congratulate you for a fine year this year. You've really done a fine service for the Sir Knights of Iowa. Sir Knight Rusty, I extend to you my best wishes for a successful upcoming year. If there is anything I can do or the Grand Encampment can do to help you out in any way, don't hesitate to ask.

"Again, Sir Knights, I thank you for the courtesies and hospitality extended me. It's been a pleasure to be with you."
